# **Keep Christ in Every Day**

"But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.'" (Luke 2:10-11)

During this time of year we usually hear the phrase, "Keep Christ in Christmas." Certainly this is a good thing to keep in mind during the Christmas season. As our country becomes more secularized during this time when people are concerned about buying all the right gifts, as people become busy to go to all of the parties, and as people stress over making the desserts and treats, it's easy for anyone to forget the main reason to celebrate Christmas.

But after the Christmas season when the lights come down, the Christmas sales are over, and the Christmas songs and movies stop playing, people go back to their lives and seem to lose the joy we just celebrated. Why is that? Why is it that after Christmas we do not hear people say we should keep Christ in everyday of our lives?

This was the message of the angels to the shepherds on that first Christmas night. They proclaimed a message of great joy that was meant for all people for all time: Christ the Savior was born! Let this Christmas joy, the message of Christ's birth, remain with you even after the Christmas season. Keep Christ in everyday of your lives. Rejoice every day that our Savior was born to live and die for you. There is no greater joy than this! The message we hear on Christmas that a Savior was born for us fills us with joy because we are forgiven. And this forgiveness we have received from Christ remains with us always.

Therefore let this joy of the birth of Christ our Savior be evident in your lives every day. Keep Christ in Christmas. Keep Christ in New Years. Keep Christ in Easter. Keep Christ in your birthday. Keep Christ in your anniversary. Keep Christ in your days of sorrow and in your days of joy. Keep Christ in every day. May God keep this Christmas joy in you as you celebrate our Savior's birth not only during this season but also during all the days of your life.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS: In the city of Merrill during December, January, February, and March, no person shall park any vehicle on any street except on:

- The odd-numbered side of any street on odd-numbered days.
- 2. The even-numbered side of any street on even-numbered days.

Since the church's address is **1204** N. Sales Street, vehicles not in the church parking lot should be parked on the <u>church (west) side</u> of Sales Street on even-numbered days and on the <u>east side of Sales Street on odd-numbered days</u>.

**MEN'S BIBLE STUDY:** (Pastor) Neil Varnum will be leading the group through a study of <u>The Book of the Twelve (The Minor Prophets)</u>. The Minor Prophets are the last 12 books of the Old Testament, *Hosea - Malachi*. They are called Minor Prophets because they are much shorter in length than the Major Prophets (*Isaiah - Daniel*).

The **December 21** class will be an introduction to the book of **Amos** and an overview of its message. It may be helpful to read the book of Amos ahead of time to get a flavor of it before coming to the Bible study.


