March through Holy Week (Part Two)

In last month's Messenger I wrote a devotion for marching through Holy Week focusing on the bigger days of that week. Since this week is Holy Week I have decided to have us focus on the other days of Holy Week and all that happened.

Monday: Two things happened on this day. Jesus entered into the temple courts and cleared it. He overturned the tables of the money changers and drove them out of the temple. The reason for this was because they had changed God's temple from being a house of prayer and made it into a den of robbers. Also on this day Jesus made a fig tree wither since it had no fruit even though it was in bloom. After the tree withered Jesus used this as a lesson to teach his disciples that when they pray they should not doubt but believe. Let what Jesus did on this day serve as a reminder for us as well. When we come to church it is to be a time of meditation, of prayer, and of listening to God. And as we pray let us not doubt but trust that God listens and answers our prayers.

Tuesday: This day is sometimes called "Busy Tuesday" because of everything that happens. This is the day where the Pharisees and the Sadducees really tested Jesus with their questions. They questioned Jesus about his authority to do things. They asked him if it was right to pay taxes to Caesar. They questioned him about the resurrection and which commandment was the greatest. Jesus answered all of their questions and the people were amazed at this teaching. During the evening of this day Jesus taught about the end of days, and how one day he would return in all of his glory and authority to judge all people.

Wednesday: This day has the nickname "Silent Wednesday" because we are not told of anything Jesus did on this day. What Scripture does tell us is that on this day the religious leaders were looking for some way to arrest Jesus. They found a way to do this because on this day Judas Iscariot went to them to betray Jesus for money.

Saturday: By now Jesus had died on the cross and was quickly buried in a tomb. You might think that the religious leaders would have been done dealing with Jesus since he was dead, but they approached Pontius Pilate and said, "We remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, 'After three days I will rise again.'" They wanted permission from Pilate to have guards posted at the tomb so that the disciples wouldn't steal Jesus body and deceive the people that Jesus was alive. Pilate agreed to this, and the tomb was made as secure as possible by putting a seal on the tomb and had guards stationed at the tomb.

Easter Sunday: Even though the religious leaders tried their best to stop the disciples from stealing Jesus' body, they didn't expect Jesus to rise from the dead. But that's exactly what happened. The angels rolled away the stone from the tomb, not to allow Jesus to exit out of the tomb but to allow others to see that Jesus was no longer dead but alive. But Jesus' resurrection is important not just by showing us that Jesus is alive, but since Jesus rose from the dead our sins have been forgiven and he will give us eternal life.

So as we once again march through Holy Week let us grow in our appreciation for what Christ did. Even though during this week he would be betrayed, denied, abandoned, beaten, and killed, Jesus still entered into Jerusalem to endure all of this in order to save us, to make us triumphant over sin, death, and the devil, and to bring us to our eternal home.
