# **2021 Holy Week Services**

To meet the various worship needs of the congregation, services will be held as follows:

**Thursday, April 1**: A combination Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service for those who wish to attend with COVID-19 guidelines in place. Worship will begin at 6:30 pm and Holy Communion will be offered.

**Friday, April 2**: A combination Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service for those who prefer the traditional worship service. Worship will begin at 6:30 pm and Holy Communion will be offered.

# He is Risen!

#### He is not here; he has risen! (Luke 24:6)

On Easter Sunday it is customary to greet one another by saying, "He is risen!" to which the other person will respond by saying, "He is risen indeed!" It's such a simple sentence, but it's a very important sentence. In this devotion I want us just to focus on that one word "is." Why is that one word so important? Imagine if we greeted each other by saying, "He was risen." This wouldn't be the worst thing to say but it could give the impression that what Jesus did no longer applies for us, as if it were just a random past event. Or it could give the impression that Jesus was risen but he no longer is. Or imagine if we greeted each other by saying, "He will be risen." If that were the case then Jesus is still dead and therefore there would be no reason to celebrate Easter Sunday.

But Jesus is risen indeed! Since he is risen there are many comforts in this fact. First of all, we have the comfort that Jesus is true God. No one took his life from him but he gave it up on his own accord. Not only by his own power did he give up his life but also by his own power he took up his life again.

Another comfort we find in the fact that Jesus is risen is that our sins are forgiven. Scripture says, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins." If Christ were still dead then we wouldn't have a Savior from our sins. But since Christ is risen we are not in our sins anymore; they have been forever removed from us.

Since Jesus is risen this means that he is living right now. A comfort we find in this fact that our risen and ever-living Savior is preparing a place for us in heaven. He is ruling over all things for the good of his believers. As the famous hymn I Know My Redeemer says, "He lives to silence all my fears; He lives to wipe away my tears. He lives to calm my troubled heart; He lives all blessings to impart."

And since Jesus is preparing a place for us in heaven another comfort of his resurrection is that we have eternal life in him. As Jesus promised, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies." But what about death itself? It can feel like death still has the victory as it takes away the life of our loved ones and one day will take our life as well. What comfort can we find? One more comfort of the fact that Jesus is risen is that one day we will be raised from the dead. Jesus said, "Because I live, you too will live." On the Last Day Jesus will raise us believers from physical death to everlasting life, and on that day we can say about ourselves, "I am risen indeed!" This is why the Easter greeting of, "He is risen indeed" is so important; let us rejoice to use this greeting not only on Easter but on every day of our lives.
