#### "Our Father in heaven" (Matthew 6:9)

Pop Quiz: what do the universe, Jesus Christ, and Christians have in common? They all have the same father. In June we celebrate Father's Day. There are many things from Scripture that can be said for fathers such as: fathers instructing their children in the faith or taking care of their children. These things are vital for fathers to do, and by no means am I ignoring this for this month's devotion, but I am writing this devotion to focus on how God is the Father.

God is the Father because of creation. Malachi 2:10 says, "Have we not all one Father? Did not one God create us?" Although God the Son and God the Holy Spirit also played a part in creation, it is God the Father who is credited as the one who made us. The biggest things of creation, the stars and planets, and the smallest things of creation, cells and atoms, were created by God the Father. Yet the greatest thing God the Father created was us, mankind. We were created in the perfect image of God.

But we ruined God's creation and lost the perfect image of God when we fell into sin. We see this in our relationship with our fathers and children. As fathers, we are not perfect. We can be harsh with our children, punish them unfairly, or take them for granted. As children, we didn't always listen to our favors, accept their discipline, or we took them for granted. This is the sin of our sinful nature rising up against us. Because of our sins we don't deserve to call God our Father.

But here we see another reason why **God** is called the **Father**. He is the **Father of Jesus Christ**. How exactly God the Father and Jesus Christ who are both eternal can have this relationship of father and son our minds can never understand. But this is what Scripture says. Another surprising thing about this relationship is what God the Father sent his Son to do. Would any of you fathers send your son whom you love to die for the worst of people? None of us would, but that's what God the Father did. Jesus said, "Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up." Because of Jesus, God's Son, we have been saved from our sins.

And this brings us to the final reason why God is the Father. Although all creation calls God their Father, as believers we call God our Father for a special reason. Galatians 3:26-27 says, "You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." As believers we call God our Father because we have been adopted by faith. As believers we call God our Father because through baptism we are connected with Christ, God's Son.

So as we celebrate Father's Day this month, let us not only show appreciation to our earthly fathers, but let us also show appreciation to God our Father. He is our Father for he made us. He is our Father for he sent his Son, Jesus Christ, to be our Savior. He is our Father because we have been adopted by him through faith and baptism.

**Sunday, 9:00 am:** To avoid traffic bottlenecks in the entryway between services, 9:00 am attendees are asked to arrive at church no earlier than 8:40 am. If you do need to come early, please be respectful of others and social distance as the 8:00 am service dismisses. The open area near the picture board has been designated as an informal waiting area.

**All services:** Sermons will be approximately 10-12 minutes in length. This allows everyone to hear the same message in a time that fits all service formats.
