# *A Bond of Love*

*“Do not hide your face from me, do not turn your servant away in anger; you have been my helper. Do not reject me or forsake me, O God my Savior. Though my father and mother forsake me, the LORD will receive me.” (Psalm 27:9-10)*

On May 9<sup>th</sup> we will be celebrating Mother’s Day, and **what a blessing motherhood is both for mothers and for children.** Even before we were born we heard our mother’s voice and the songs and melodies that she would sing and hum to us. When our mothers heard our cries for the first time this brought tears of joy to her eyes. Our mothers were the first ones to teach us about our ABC’s, 123’s, and about Jesus as our Savior. As mothers you have the joy of watching your children grow. And for us who are now adults who no longer live with our mothers, we still love and thank them for everything they did for us and still do for us.

So it is appropriate for us to think of our mothers and thank them, not only on Mother’s Day but everyday. Yet, I, and possibly you as well, have experienced people who do not like Mother’s Day, not because of the commercialism but for different reasons. Some people didn’t grow up with a mother. Some people grew up with mothers who weren’t kind and loving as they should have been. Some people, now as adults, have a poor relationship with their mothers. Therefore the concept of celebrating Mother’s Day can bring grief and hard feelings.

And how is it possible that people can have grief and hard feelings with their mothers? It’s because of our sinful nature. As children we don’t perfectly honor our mothers as we should, and even growing up as adults we still don’t perfectly honor them and therefore poor relationships can happen. As mothers we may not perfectly love our children and care for them as we should. So it is possible that a mother may forsake her own child.

It is for this very reason I quoted the passage above from the book of Psalms. I would encourage you to read Psalm 27 which begins by saying that the Lord is our light and salvation and therefore we have nothing to fear. We don’t even have to fear if our own fathers and mothers forsake us because the Lord receives us. He never hides his face from us but always turns his face toward us to listen and to help us. Although the Lord should reject and forsake us because of our sins, Jesus Christ was rejected and forsaken by his Father on the cross so that he can be our Savior. Therefore, **as strong as a bond of love is between a mother and her child, the bond of love between the Lord and us is even stronger.**

**So as we celebrate Mother’s Day thanking our mothers for everything they do, let us also thank our Lord who has given us our mothers.** And if you don’t plan on celebrating Mother’s Day for whatever reason because of your past, we can still **thank our Lord for he never rejects or forsakes us because he is our Savior who will receive us both now and forevermore.**

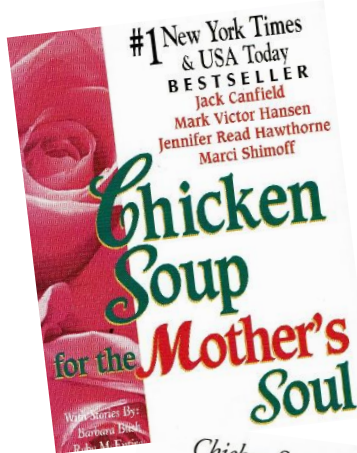
## Summer Vacation Bible School



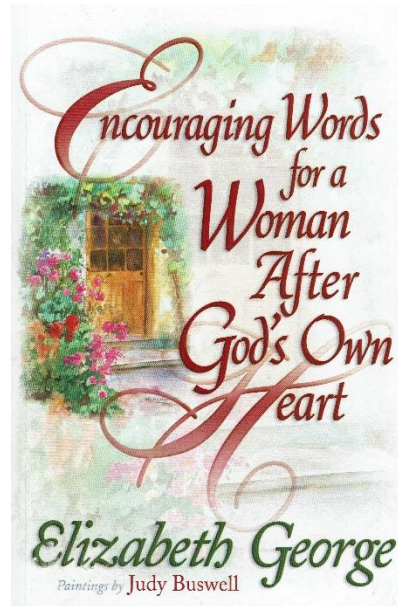

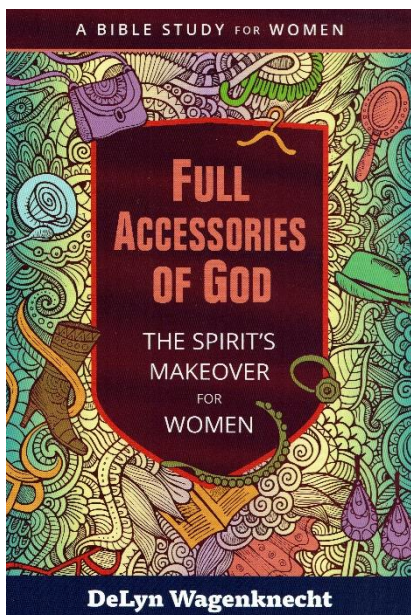
## Check out what's NEW in our church library!
