To accommodate the differing spacing needs of members, ushers will bring tables of 20 forward like normal, then come back around a second time after assistants have communed to usher those who desire more spacing in groups of 10 or less; Pastor will handle distribution of both bread and wine for the latter format. Rejoice in the Light

Your sun will never set again, and your moon will wane no more; the LORD will be your everlasting light, and your days of sorrow will end. (Isaiah 60:20)

What are your favorite days of the year? Maybe it's Christmas or other holidays. Maybe it's your birthday or anniversary. Maybe it's a day that's only special to you and no one else. If you were to ask my father about his favorite day of the year it would be the day of the summer solstice which is the longest day of the year. Countless times I witnessed my father sitting on his deck watching the sun set on this day.

It's interesting how often Scripture talks about light. The first thing God created was light. Jesus calls himself the light of the world. In the passage above it mentions how the sun and its light will never set again.

But why does Scripture emphasize light so much? It's because night is often associated with things that are negative. During the night it becomes colder and we become tired. During the night typically crimes and other sinful actions happen. During troubles we often view this as times of darkness.

This is why **the message of Scripture that in heaven the sun and its light will never set gives us comfort.** In heaven we won't have to worry about becoming cold or tired because those things won't exist. In heaven we won't have to be afraid of crimes or acts of sin happening because we will all be perfect. In heaven we won't have to worry about troubles because God will keep all of those things from us.

But do we deserve this glorious light of heaven? We don't. By nature we are spiritually blind to the glorious message of God's Word and won't accept it. By nature we are spiritually sinful; we commit countless crimes against God which separate us from God. By nature, because of our sins, we deserve times of trouble and hardship in life.

But the Lord our God didn't want us to remain in the darkness of sin. **The Lord our God sent the Holy Spirit to reveal the light of the gospel to see how much God loves us. Jesus, the light of the world, suffered and died on the cross for our sins.** This is why the sky during the middle of the day became dark when he was crucified because he was being punished for our sins. But then the Lord our God raised Jesus from the dead at daylight of that first Easter morning to assure us that since Jesus lives he is preparing a place for us in heaven where we will have no troubles anymore.

So let us rejoice in the light we have in God. Since he has revealed his gospel to us, since he suffered and died for us, since he rose from the dead for us, we all have the promise of the eternal light of heaven which will never end.


