Called Out

"The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (Matthew 9:37-38)

Just recently I asked my Wednesday morning Bible class what the word "church" meant? Many of us might say that church is where we meet for worship. That's the practical thing about church, but the word "church" literally means, "called out." So the reason we call ourselves a church is because we have been called out of spiritual darkness and death into God's spiritual light and life. In this aspect all believers are called out.

But in certain aspects, some believers are called out to serve in the public ministry. This is why they are called, "called workers." Out church knows how important it is to have a called worker. We went through a long period of not having a called worker of our own. And I just want you to remember how difficult that was for you, and the joy you had when you received a called worker.

The reason I bring this up is because this month our synodical college and seminary will be having graduates hoping to receive a divine call into ministry. It is not a guarantee that those who graduate will receive a divine call. I know of classmates who didn't receive a divine call until years later. Therefore pray for them that everything they have done to prepare for the ministry will come into fruition.

Also pray for the churches and schools that are requesting a graduate to be their called workers. Right now there are more vacancies than those graduating to be called workers. So it's not a guarantee that every church and school will receive a called servant this month. Therefore pray for these churches and schools that they will receive a called worker, and if they don't, pray that they will receive one soon.

And finally also pray for those who are called workers who are currently contemplating taking another divine call. Pray that they will do what is best for themselves, for their families, and for the best of God's kingdom.

And the ultimate motivation to pray for all of this is not only because Jesus' commands us to pray for this, but also because Jesus also prayed for us as well. Therefore pray for your called workers, pray for those who are hoping to be a called worker, pray for those who are calling called workers, and pray for God's kingdom in general.

THE CERTAINTY OF CHRISTIAN FAITH






