# Military, Government, War

On November 11<sup>th</sup> our nation celebrates Veterans Day. On this day we remember those who have served and are serving in the military and thanking them for their service. But throughout time Christians have wondered, "Is it right for a Christian to serve in the military? Should a Christian serve a government that may not be a Christian government? Should Christians fight in a war?" Let's look at what Scripture has to say about these questions.

Is it right for a Christian to serve in the military? During John the Baptist's ministry some who came to visit him were Roman soldiers. They asked John what they should do, and he responded, "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely – be content with your pay." Notice that John the Baptist did not tell these soldiers that they had to leave the military. If serving in the military was a sin then he certainly would have told them that. But instead he told them to do their jobs faithfully and be content with their pay. Therefore a Christian can serve in the military.

Should a Christian serve a government that may not be a Christian government? Romans 13:1 says, "Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God." These words don't just apply to those serving in the military but to all of us. Even if a government is not Christian we still serve them because God has established our government. As long as the government does not force us to disobey God we obey our government. Therefore it is not wrong for a Christian to serve the government even if that government is not Christian.

**Should Christians fight in a war?** Still speaking about the government Romans 13:4 says, "He is God's servant to do you good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword for nothing." If our country is attacked then the government has the right to bear the sword and fight back. Our country has the right to defend itself, or to protect the lives of others. Therefore it is not wrong for Christians to fight in a war.

Also, let's look at the words of Jesus who once said, "Greater love has no one then this, that he lay down his life for his friends." We have soldiers who have given up their lives for us and to protect our country with its freedoms. Because of them we are able to live in a country where we are able to worship our Savior who gave up his life for us while we were still his enemies. This is a great act of love our military does for us, and therefore let us remember and thank them for their service. And ultimately let us thank our God that he has established our government for our good and that he has provided us with those who serve in the military to protect us.



Offerings for the year continue to trend below budget, but expenses are also trending below budget. While actual offerings are approximately \$14,825 below budgeted offerings, we are carrying a positive amount of approximately \$27,230 in the general fund.
