Confession

During the season of Lent a lot of emphasis is placed on confession. But what exactly is confession? What sins should we confess? To whom should I confess my sins? How do I know if I have committed sin? How should I feel after I confess my sins? What should I do when someone confesses their sins to me?

Thankfully, Martin Luther in his *Small Catechism* gives us the answer to these questions based on what Scripture says. Therefore, for this month's devotion I simply want us to remember what Luther wrote to us.

First: What is confession?

Confession has two parts. The one is that we confess our sins; the other, that we receive absolution or forgiveness from the pastor as from God himself, not doubting but firmly believing that our sins are thus forgiven before God in heaven.

Second: What sins should we confess?

Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer. But before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

Third: How can we recognize these sins?

Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments. Are you a father, mother, son, daughter, employer, or employee? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you hurt anyone by word or deed? Have you been dishonest, careless, wasteful, or done other wrong?

Fourth: How will the pastor assure a penitent sinner of forgiveness?

He will say, "By the authority of Christ, I forgive you your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."



New Youth Resource

"Who Am I?" is a three-part youth ministry resource that takes an in-depth look at real-life problems that overwhelm teens with feelings of being unloved, worthless, guilty, anxious, lonely, and more.


The **videos** explore the identity crisis among teens and look to root their identity in Christ through the facts of God's Word instead of personal feelings. Each video contains numerous "pause points" for the youth leader (or a parent) to stop the video and interact in personal discussion before continuing. The series is adaptable for use in a youth group ministry setting, home setting, or for personal teen viewing.

May this series speak into the anxious lives of young people and remind them, "You are someone. You are loved."

New Bible Study

Helping the Hurting with Hope is a new Bible class to help participants appreciate the role of compassion in a Christian's personal and congregational life. It provides gospel motivation for participants to go beyond their comfort zones and act in compassionate ways through the Spirit's power. Where the Bible class succeeds in cultivating compassion, congregations will be better spiritual refuges for people with broken lives and welcome people looking for a church family where they can walk a new path after release from prison, or in recovery from addiction, or starting a new life after a public fall into sin.



Helping the Hurting with Hope is available on the WELS Congregational Services website. It comprises an introductory lesson with a video and four additional lessons. The participants' lessons, leader's guide, and video are downloadable.

Informational brochures for dealing with mental health issues are available to download.

- Ask a Therapist This flyer gives you important questions to ask counselors when you seek counseling and don't have access to WELS counselors.
- *Christian or Non-Christian Counselor* This flyer outlines potential concerns when a counselor is not a Christian, or is a Christian but not of your faith.
- Mental Health Issues This flyer will guide you when you believe you might need counseling for mental health issues.
- *Therapy Models* This pamphlet helps you sort out psychological terms and distinguish between different counseling processes.
- When to Refer This flyer is written to help pastors determine when a member is in need of other forms of counseling in addition to the spiritual counseling he offers.

The <u>WELS/ELS Christian Therapists Network</u> provides a network for professionally-trained therapists in fellowship with the WELS or ELS to enhance the delivery of Bible-based, Christ-centered therapy. It is a referral source for WELS/ELS congregations and called workers, and the Network helps Christians find professionally-trained, Christian therapists in their area.

Another resource for WELS called workers and their families, and for members of WELS churches, is Christ-centered counseling through WLCFS-Christian Family Solutions. <u>WLCFS-Christian Family Solutions</u> provides an array of <u>counseling services</u> including outpatient, intensive outpatient, day treatment programs, and psychiatry. Their services are available in person or through a secure video connection (telehealth) in some states.
