Some Things Never Change

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8)

In my opinion there is something about the month of October that you notice changes. There's a change in weather. Not too long ago we were using our air conditioners, and now we have the heat turned on in our homes. Although the days have been getting shorter since June you really start to notice how short they are by now. The leaves on trees are starting to turn color. Farmers are harvesting their crops. Multiple changes are happening.

Changes are not always a bad thing, but in our lives we like to have things as they are. We like to be in control in our lives and to have stability. But changes do happen that change everything. You get that one phone call out of the blue that changes your life. The health that you once enjoyed changes and makes life more difficult. The business you work at downsizes and you lose your job, and therefore your financial situation changes.

The reason we have changes that cause loss and pain and struggles is because of us. Our God, who is love, created us to live perfectly with him in paradise on earth. God never intended that to change, but our first parents, Adam and Eve, disobeyed God and brought the biggest change in history. Sin had entered into the world, and from Adam and Eve we inherit a sinful nature. That's something about us that never changes. Even though Christ has set us free from the power of the devil we still fall prey to Satan's temptations and disobey God. Even when we try our hardest to fight against sin and to change our lives we can still sin against God. For this we should be punished by God since yesterday, today, and forever in hell.

But notice what the above passage says. Jesus Christ is the same from all eternity. God's plan to have us live with him forever never changed. Although we disobeyed God and deserve his wrath and punishment, God sent Christ to be our perfect Savior and to lay down his life for our sins. This salvation is ours through faith and that promise from God about our salvation will never change. God made us to be his own and when he adopted us as his children, he promised to do all things for us and to keep us connected with him. That promise in Christ will never change. One day God will take us to our heavenly home where we live with him forever. That promise will never change. God will never change his mind that the salvation and the promise of eternal life is in Christ.

So when changes happen in life, whether they are good or negative changes, remember that Jesus Christ our God and Savior never changes. Turn to him for help, for forgiveness, and for comfort and he will give that to you for he loves us and we are his, and that will never change.

BE PART OF CHRISTMAS 2023!

Keeping with our congregational goal to increase our evangelism efforts in the Merrill community, we will be undertaking a program called "C23" (short for "Christmas 2023") to share the gospel with souls in our area prior to and on Christmas Eve. A simple way to do that—invite them to come with you to our congregation's 6:30 pm Wednesday Advent and 9:00 am Christmas Eve worship services. Each member, young and old, can embrace the privilege and responsibility of sharing Christ with unchurched friends, relatives, and neighbors.

C23 is a program produced by WELS Congregational Services to help our church and members undertake this effort. Christmas Eve has surpassed Easter as the worship service unchurched individuals are most likely to attend. A recent survey found 80% of unchurched adults would seriously consider accepting an invitation, extended by a friend, to attend a Christmas Eve service.

Christmas Eve will be here before you know it. Whom will you reach?
