

#### Called by God to Serve

Therefore it is necessary to choose one of the men who have been with us the whole time the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from John's baptism to the time when Jesus was taken up from us. For one of these must become a witness with us of his resurrection."

So they proposed two men: Joseph called Barsabbas (also known as Justus) and Matthias. Then they prayed, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which of these two you have chosen to take over this apostolic ministry, which Judas left to go where he belongs." Then they cast lots, and the lot fell to Matthias; so he was added to the eleven apostles. (Acts 1:21-26).

Just recently I received a divine call to serve as the pastor at Faith Lutheran Church in Radcliff, KY. I returned that call to remain here as your pastor. This got me thinking about this account of Matthias. Matthias was not originally a part of the twelve disciples. But after Judas betrayed Jesus and hung himself the remaining eleven apostles decided to fill Judas' place with someone else in order to fulfill Scripture.

Notice how seriously the apostles took this task. They did not choose someone randomly. They had certain requirements that this replacement needed. He needed to be with Jesus during his whole ministry, and he must have seen Jesus' resurrection. There were two men who fit those requirements: Barsabbas and Matthias. In order to determine whom they should pick, the apostles prayed to God and they cast lots. The lot fell to Matthias and he became an apostle. This is the only information that is provided about him in Scripture.


Even though Scripture doesn't give us any more details about Matthias there is a lot we can learn here, specifically about the calling process. Although our calling process today is a little different than when Matthias was called, there are similarities. Our synod does not allow just anyone to be a called worker. There are credentials that a person must have in order to be a called worker. For instance, the apostle Paul gives us a detailed list of what a pastor should be in 1 Timothy 3:1-7. Our called workers go through years of training and instruction. Another similarity is that our pastors and teachers are called by God. Just like the apostles here, we pray to God during our calling process, and it is God who sends out his workers where he desires.

But what about you personally? How does this account apply to you? Even though you may not be a called worker, God has still called you to serve where you are. God has given all of us different vocations in life whether it be employers or employees, parents or children, or teachers or students, etc. What a great comfort this is to know that God has purpose for you and has called you to serve in that capacity. Therefore, just as Matthias was called by God to serve him, serve God wherever he has called you to serve.

# HYMNAL HIGHLIGHT: WHY THE NAME CHANGE FROM MAUNDY THURSDAY TO HOLY THURSDAY?

One reason is that many people no longer understand the meaning of the word Maundy (from the Latin *mandatum*, referencing the new command Jesus gave his disciples on this day; see John 13:34).

Our primary focus that day is on the institution of Holy Communion, which isn't directly tied to the new command. The Anglican term for this day, "Maundy Thursday," derives from Jesus' command in Latin: Mandatum novum do vobis. "A new command I give you . . ." (John 13:34). In the CW lectionary, the Gospel with this maundy command only occurs in Year A—hence, Holy Thursday is the name for this occasion.

The service for us has always been far more about the **new covenant** than the **new commandment**. The Year C First Reading is Jeremiah 31:31-34. The commentary on that reading ends with these words: "This is the covenant whose terms were put into effect on the day that begins tonight. This is the covenant whose blessings are wrapped up and delivered to us in the meal we celebrate tonight."

## Our Church's Online Presence: Preparation for Attending Worship Online

- 1. **Get there early.** Just like when attending in person, getting to our YouTube channel (youtube.com/@christmerrill) early is important to help you get in the right frame of mind for worship. Pull up the service early and make sure your internet connection is good. Even if we are not streaming yet you will be able to connect. We can see if someone is waiting for the service to start. We try very hard to go live at least 5 minutes before the start of the service and you will have the same pre-service music we are hearing in person thanks to our organist. If you have the service ready before we go live you will have a placeholder and will know we are live when you hear that music.
- 2. **Prepare.** You don't have to put on a suit or even comb/brush your hair but be ready to go as soon as we go live or you connect. This makes the service a real priority for you instead of just noise in the background. Of course, dressing up may enhance the worship experience for you.
- 3. **Put everything else aside.** Speaking of just noise, don't treat the livestream or recording as background to whatever you are doing. Take the time to sit down and participate. Of course, you may have other things going on like babies crying/sick; someone to take care of; or personal needs that need to be met = that is after all why you couldn't be at church in person. But, if possible, make the service what you are doing at that moment the same way you would when you attend in person. Oh, and unlike being in church, the pause button works even when we are live; so if you need to take that break, hit the **II pause** icon and when you get back hit the **> start** button and continue. The service will continue from when you paused it.
- 4. **Participate.** We stream the text for pretty much everything that is in the hymnal the liturgy, prayers, psalms, and even the musical notes and lyrics for the hymns so that you can follow/sing along with the inperson congregation. It may seem a little unusual singing by yourself at first, but the more you participate the more you become a part of the service and, hopefully, the more meaningful it will be for you.
- 5. **Let us know who is watching.** We want to know who is watching simply so that we can better serve you. If we are fulfilling a temporary need, we are so glad to do it. If you watch regularly because you can't be with us in person the church elders would like to know that also. The numbers are also being reported to the synod so that they can better support your needs in the future. Starting in March we will include a link in the description box for you to fill out a quick survey so that we can have a more accurate idea of those to whom we are ministering.
- 6. **Enjoy.** We hope you enjoy your experience and hope even more that you will be back soon to participate in our worship services in person. In whichever way you participate, please give us feedback as to how we can serve you better.
