Nothing Really Changes

"I the LORD do not change. So you, the descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed. Ever since the time of your ancestors you have turned away from my decrees and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you," says the LORD Almighty. Malachi 3:6-7

"3...2...1...HAPPY NEW YEAR!" If you had the energy on New Year's Eve you probably said these words to usher in the new year. A lot of people like to celebrate New Year's, but why is celebrating it all that special? When you really think about, **nothing really changes** from December 31st to January 1st. A lot of people get excited for the new year because they view it as a new year full of possible changes. This is why many people make new year resolutions in order to change something about their life such as: being healthier, traveling more, etc. But you know what usually happens with new year resolutions; they don't come true. Therefore **nothing changes**.

In these words from Malachi we notice something that never changes, and it's the Lord. But also notice what never changes according to Malachi: how sinful we are. Malachi was sent to preach his message to the Israelites around the year 400 B.C. The Israelites have returned from exile, they have rebuilt the temple, and they had promised to be faithful to God. But guess what happened? The Israelites began to be unfaithful to God once again. They were acting just like their forefathers who disobeyed God. So once again nothing changed for the Israelites.

Do you see yourself acting just like the Israelites? Just like the Israelites you may have promised to be more faithful to God. Perhaps even with the new year beginning you wanted to change your lifestyle by staying away from certain sins and living a more God-pleasing life. But no matter how hard we try, guess what happens? We can fall back into those same sins again and again. Just like Paul, we too have to say, "For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do – this I keep on doing" (Romans 7:19). The reason we do this is because of our sinful nature that makes us not to be faithful to God. No matter how hard we try not to sin, it seems like nothing changes.

But praise be to God that he never changes! God promised to send us a Savior, and he never changed his mind about that. What Christ has accomplished for us, God will never change his mind about that. We will always be saved by grace through faith in Christ our Savior. And when it comes to repentance, God never changes his mind about that. Therefore when we return to God with a broken and contrite heart asking for his forgiveness, God will return to us to bring us his grace and forgiveness. And it is his grace and forgiveness that truly changes us to live a more God-pleasing life. Therefore when you struggle with sin and want to change that, go to God so that he will motivate you to live a Christian life not only during this new year but for every day of your life.

Expected (budgeted) expenses through 11/30: \$141,365.00

Our offerings for the year continue to trend below budget, but our expenses are also trending below budget. While our actual offerings are approximately \$18,500 below budgeted offerings, we are carrying a positive amount of approximately \$26,400 in the general fund.




