Simon the Zealot

"Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God."

(Romans 13:1)

Simon the Zealot was one of Jesus' twelve disciples. We don't know much about him, but Scripture describes him as being a Zealot. What does that mean? The Zealots were a group of people who hated the Roman government ruling over Israel. The Zealots vehemently opposed the Roman government and would cause riots and uprisings against the Romans. Did Simon ever participate in these violent actions? We don't know. We do know that Jesus reached out to Simon, and Simon would have seen Jesus respecting the government, and that would have influenced Simon.

So what can we learn from Simon? There's a reason that Simon the Zealot was picked for this month's edition of the Messenger. In this month our nation will be electing a new president to rule our country. As you have seen and heard, people have varying opinions about the candidates running for office. Sometimes people may say nasty and hateful things about these candidates. Maybe even you yourself have done some of these things.

If we have done this, let us not just think, "Well, this just deals with politics. Everyone is thinking and speaking in this way." God tells us to submit to our government and to respect them. The reason why we submit to our government and respect them is because every government has been established by God. But there have been times that we have shown disrespect to our government. There have been times that we have taken what they have said and done in not the kindest possible way. There have been times that we scrutinize everything our government does and grumble and complain about our government. Is our government perfect? No, but God has still established our government. Therefore, if we don't respect our government then we are not respecting God.

Therefore, let us ask God for forgiveness for the times we have sinned against our government, and ask God to move us to respect and appreciate our government. God has established government to enforce laws, to protect us, and to take care of us. And whoever ends up winning the election and whoever will rule our nation in the future, remember that God is always in control. He rules over all things including our nation. Therefore, put your trust in him and respect the government he has established. That's what Simon the Zealot did, and that's what we can learn from him.
