Look at All the Blessings

Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?" Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish. When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." So they gather them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten. (John 6:8-9, 11-13)

The third Monday of January has been nicknamed Blue Monday because it's considered the saddest day of the year. Multiple reasons are given why this day is considered the saddest day of the year: the excitement of the holidays is over, the weather is cold and the days are short, credit card bills need to be paid, new year resolutions that were made have been broken, etc. Maybe you may even find yourself being a little more depressed during this time of the year, and this is why I want us to focus on the apostle Andrew.

Although Andrew may not have been depressed in the above account, he had his doubts. Five thousand people have gathered to see Jesus. It was time to eat but no one had brought any food. Jesus told the disciples to feed the crowd, and he did this to test them. Andrew brought forward a young boy with his small meal, but Andrew thought there was no way that could feed everyone. Jesus took the small meal, thanked God, and fed five thousand people. Then he told the disciples to pick up the leftovers, and they filled twelve baskets with food. Just imagine the look on Andrew's face who earlier said the meal couldn't feed everyone was now holding a basket full of food after the people had their fill.

Now think about how this applies to us. When we are sad or depressed we usually only focus on the negatives, the impossibilities, the struggles in life. Therefore, we may focus on how the excitement of the holidays is over, on how the weather is cold and the days are short, on how we need to pay the credit card bills, on how we may have broken new year resolutions, and on everything else.

But let us learn from Andrew who once doubted but saw what Jesus could do. **Look at all the blessings the Lord has given you throughout your life, throughout this past year, and the blessings he has given you in this new year so far.** Even though the excitement of the holidays may be over, the message of Christmas applies to us each day for Christ was born to be our Savior. Even though the weather is colder and the days are shorter, each day is a gift of God's grace and his mercies are new every morning. Even though the credit card bills are due, the Lord has given us jobs and money to pay those bills. Even though we may have broken our new year resolutions, the Lord has promised to bless the work of our hands in all we do. Therefore, just like Andrew who looked down and saw a full basket of food, let us look at all the blessings from our Lord and let this fill us with joy.





Make a Difference with SCRIP!

Support Northland Lutheran High School (NLHS) effortlessly with SCRIP! Choose from a wide selection of gift cards and make your everyday purchases count. Connect with **Cindy, our church's SCRIP coordinator**, to place your order today.

How does SCRIP work?

You purchase gifts cards for your everyday expenses such as gas, groceries, clothing, household items or dining out. A percentage of each gift card you purchase is given to NLHS as a rebate. For example, Kwik Trip offers a 5% rebate so if you purchase a \$100 card from the NLHS Scrip Program, NLHS receives \$5 from the transaction.

Which businesses offer SCRIP cards?

See the full listing on the back side of this page, on the SCRIP table in the church narthex and in the rack to the right of the Education bulletin board in the hallway.

What is the SCRIP Tuition Credit option?

This option allows you to split the rebate from your SCRIP purchases 50/50 between Northland Lutheran High School and your family. Using the example from above, the \$5 rebate would now be split with \$2.50 going to NLHS and \$2.50 being 'banked' for your family's personal tuition obligation. All accounts are maintained by the NLHS SCRIP Office and tuition credits that accumulate are used the following academic year.

How do I start a family account for the SCRIP Tuition Credit option?

Complete a Family Agreement form (available at the NLHS SCRIP Office or contact NLHS at 715-359-3400) and submit it to the NLHS SCRIP Office. Once the form has been completed, your account will begin accruing tuition credit with your first SCRIP purchase.

Accounts may be opened for newborns through 12th grade students. Once your family account has been started, grandparents, family members, coworkers, neighbors or friends can have their SCRIP purchases applied to your account – just have them provide your family account's name and account number at the time of purchase.

Dime and Dollar

Dime and Dollar is a thrift store that is made up largely of volunteers. This ministry shares God's Word with the community and provides necessary items to the community at reduced prices. Dime and Dollar also provides tuition assistance support for all Northland families by contributing about \$200,000 per year and has given over \$3 million to Northland over the years. Please consider how you can serve by donating clothes, volunteering at the store, serving as a Board member, helping with maintenance and clothes pick up, etc. Locations are at 211 Alexander St in Wausau and 1351 8th St S in Wisconsin Rapids.
